Practice

Before becoming an advocate, Gregor was a solicitor in private practice for 13 years; 9 of those years were spent working with one of Scotland's largest litigation firms. In his final two years as a solicitor, Gregor worked exclusively as a solicitor advocate appearing on behalf of the firm's clients in the Court of Session and before various tribunals.

Gregor has a great deal of experience of defending employers' and public liability claims. He also spent a large portion of his career dealing with industrial disease claims and road traffic matters. Gregor also has experience of Inquiry work, having appeared in eleven fatal accident inquiries as a solicitor. Gregor also appeared as a solicitor advocate before the Scottish Child Abuse Inquiry for a core participant.

Gregor has also worked on professional negligence and regulatory matters, acting principally for surveyors in professional negligence disputes and doctors and dentists in negligence claims and regulatory matters before the General Medical Council and the General Dental Council.
