Sentencing Statistics - E&W(1)

- The Sentencing Council's Health & Safety Offences, Corporate Manslaughter and Food Safety & Hygiene Offences Definitive Guideline – review April 2019
- Anticipation increases only for larger organisations.
- Reality all sentences are Up! Up! Up!



Sentencing Statistics - E&W(2)

- Large organisations 1380% increase
- Medium organisations 400% increase
- Small/micro organisations 126% increase
- Individuals
 - -66% increase in fines;
 - more suspended sentences



Recent Cases (1) Assessing Culpability

- R v Electricity North West Limited [2018] 4 WLR 148
 - Foreseeability relevant to sentence
 - "High culpability" only for systemic breaches of industry standards or failure to heed warnings rather than isolated oversight?



Recent Cases (2) Assessing Harm (1)

- R v Squibb Group Limited [2019] EWCA Crim 227
 - Likelihood of harm of contact with asbestos an issue of science, not law
 - How the science is characterised in terms of the guidelines an issue of law, not science.



Recent Cases (3) Assessing Harm (2)

- Faltec Europe Limited v HSE [2019] EWCA Crim 520
 - Likelihood of harm of contact with legionella an issue of science, not law
 - How the science is characterised in terms of the guidelines an issue of law, not science.



Recent Cases (4) Financial Considerations (1)

• R v NPS London Limited [2019] EWCA Crim 228

Resources of linked organisations – take into account only exceptionally

- Relevant to Step Three only, not Step Two

Resources of parent company may entitle court to ignore low/no profit of accused company



Recent Cases (5) Financial Considerations (2)

• R v Palmer Timber Limited [2019] EWCA Crim 611

- Fine may exceed annual pre-tax profit as the focus is on turnover.

Time to pay over a number of years may mean a fine is not disproportionate.



Recent Cases (6) Financial Considerations (3)

• Faltec Europe Limited v HSE [2019] CWCA Crim 520

Resources of linked organisations – take into account only exceptionally

- Fine categories are based on turnover. Is profit ever relevant?

 Leave prudent financial reserves for payment of fine out of account when assessing the level of fine
