Inquiries Act 2005

- Section 18
- Public access to inquiry proceedings and information(1)Subject to any restrictions imposed by a notice or order under section 19, the chairman must take such steps as he considers reasonable to secure that members of the public (including reporters) are able—
- (a)to attend the inquiry or **to see** and hear a simultaneous transmission of **proceedings** at the inquiry;
- (b)to obtain or to view a record of evidence and documents given, produced or provided to the inquiry or inquiry panel.



Inquiries Act 2005

• Section 17

- Evidence and procedure
- (1) Subject to any provision of this Act or of rules under section 41, the **procedure** and conduct of an inquiry are to be **such as the chairman of the inquiry may direct**.
- (3)In making any decision as to the procedure or conduct of an inquiry, the chairman **must act with fairness and** with regard also to the need to **avoid any unnecessary cost** (whether to public funds or to witnesses or others).






Evidence Video Timeline

An independent public inquiry set up to examine the events surrounding the death of Sheku Bayoh, the subsequent investigation and whether race was a factor

Sheku Bayoh died on 3 May 2015 after an incident in the street in Kirkcaldy involving officers of Police Scotland.

Mr Bayoh, who was 31, left behind a partner, two young sons and a close family.

The purpose of the Inquiry is to examine:

- . the immediate circumstances leading to the death of Mr.
- . how the police dealt with the aftermath
- . the subsequent investigation into the death
- · whether race was a factor

The Inquiry can also make recommendations to prevent deaths in similar circumstances.


